

**SAVE EL PASO'S FRANKLIN MOUNTAINS!**



**PROTECT SCENIC TRANS MOUNTAIN CORRIDOR IN NORTHWEST EL PASO**

The Public Service Board land north and south of Trans



Mountain Road is slated for commercial and residential development, changing this naturally scenic corridor, critical wildlife habitat, and potentially invaluable recreational land forever. The coming expansion of Trans Mountain Road to a much wider Freeway with four lanes with frontage roads on each side, by the Texas Department of Transportation will accelerate this process. The only way to help protect this beautiful corridor of the Trans Mountain scenic corridor on the west side of the Franklin Mountains is re-zoning all publicly owned land of the City of El Paso as currently managed by the Public Service Board (public land owned by all El Pasoans) as Natural Open Space (NOS).

Therefore, we the undersigned urge the El Paso City Council to re-zone, as Natural Open Space, all publically-owned land between the Gas Line Road and the Franklin Mountains State Park as shown on the City's Northwest Master Plan both north and south of Trans Mountain Road.
